Criteria for induction to the FSSA Legends Hall of Fame

Deadline for 2016 inductees is June 30, 2016

The intent of the FSSA Legends Hall of Fame is to honor senior players who have excelled at the game; players who, when folks are sitting around talking about softball, their names will come up. We are looking for players who have been standouts for many years.

Initially, the first player selected from a state will be considered the Director of the Selection Committee for that state. He/she will approve the induction of any future players from that state, with approval from the FSSA President and Board.

Our requirements for admission to the FSSA Legends Hall of Fame are simple and straightforward:

- You must have been a senior softball player or affiliated with senior softball for at least 10 years.
- You must be at least 60 years old to be considered.
- You must be an active player still playing the game or connected to the game in some way.
- Others must recognize you for your achievements outside of your immediate sphere of influence.
- You must be nationally known in the major plus circuit, the top level of senior softball.
- You must already be in a sports related Hall of Fame.

He is capable of starting on any team in the country in any of those positions. Jack is a coaches dream as he never complains, plays where he is needed and is exceptionally productive. He has helped our team in so many ways with his consistent defense and exceptional hitting.

Terry Nafziger was born in Normal, Illinois in 1940 and there is nothing normal about this exceptional athlete! Terry has one sister and has been married to his wife, Freida, for 57 years! The happy couple currently resides in Woodland, California where Terry plays for the SF Seals 75 major plus team and the Omen 70 major plus team.

The same consistence on the ball field translated to the work environment as Terry was an auto dealership service manager for 43 years.
